General Guidelines for Students, Parents & Staff to keep NIS Safe

Any member of the NIS community MUST inform the school if they tested positive for COVID. **CONTACT THE SCHOOL AT:** info@nis.ac.th

The school will respond to by:

- a. Communicating with relevant families/people
- b. Results from the COVID test must be sent to the School via info@nis.ac.th
- c. The school will require the person to quarantine at home for 7 days

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

All members of the NIS Community (students, parents, guardians, teachers, and staff) must agree and implement the below guidelines in the MOU:

Memorandum of Understanding

As a member of the NIS Community, I have read and understood the following guidelines and will adhere to them.

- ✓ Wear a mask in public places at all times and when working/teaching/learning at school
- ✓ Wash hands properly with soap for at least 20 seconds regularly
- ✓ Limit going to crowded places
- ✓ Limit meeting with people in groups
- ✓ Stay home if feeling sick
- ✓ Provide ATK test results when requested by the school
- ✓ Follow the guidelines from the Chiang Mai Communicable Disease Committee (CCDC) and other government mandates regarding COVID-19 protocols.

Thailand National Guidelines for Schools

The COVID-19 Health Protocols contained within this policy adhere to the latest government guidelines regarding DMHTT:

- Distancing – 1-2 meters
- Mask Wearing – at all times
- Hand Washing – at regular intervals

All school restrictions during this period follow government protocols. Below is a brief overview of the national government guidelines for schools*:

- o Contact Tracing: Schools will administer contact tracing for all students and teachers.
- o Safe Environment: Manage the air circulation in classrooms, cleaning systems, water quality, and waste management.
- o COVID Contingency Plan: The school will implement a contingency plan in the case of positive COVID tests.
- o Transportation: Monitor students commuting to schools (school vans, private cars, and public transportation).
- o Healthcare Monitoring: Monitor students, teachers, and staff who feel unwell and show symptoms of illness.

NIS COVID-19 Policy & Health Protocols

❖ Instructional Day

During this COVID-19 protocol period, the instructional day is from 7:50am – 2:50pm

❖ Symptoms

Should students exhibit any of the following symptoms, parents will be contacted to pick up their child to go home*:

- A low-grade fever of 37.5 °C/99.50 °F
- Breathing problems
- Vomiting/Diarrhea
- Severe sore throat
- Running nose
- Coughing
- Extreme Fatigue
- Loss of smell and taste

It is essential that the school has a current Emergency Contact Phone Number for each student.

We **strongly** request that your child stays at home until your child has no symptoms for a full period of 24 hours.

❖ Classroom Disinfecting & Air Circulation



Our cleaning staff will continue to disinfect all classrooms and student common areas on a regular basis. Teachers will open windows in the classrooms every two hours to manage air circulation. The air purifiers in every classroom will be turned on prior to students' arrival and will run until the end of each instructional day. Air purifiers are cleaned and maintained on a regular basis.

❖ Handwashing



The importance of proper handwashing will be presented to students. Handwashing stations are located throughout the campus. Hand sanitizer is also available in all classrooms, student common areas, as well as all entrances to the campus.

❖ Masks

Students, Teachers and Staff are required to wear masks at all times with the exception of snack break and lunch break. For ECC and Elementary, parents must provide 2 masks for their child(ren) and write his/her name and grade on them. The school will not provide masks. Students not wearing masks will be sent home.



- ❖ Canteen Services
Staggered eating times will be implemented to adhere to social distancing measures.
- ❖ Birthday & Classroom Celebrations
Birthday and classroom celebrations in school are permitted with pre-packed food delivered via the Main Office.
- ❖ Food Deliveries
All **food delivery services are banned** from NIS campus. This includes Grab, Lineman, Tuk, Food Panda, etc.
- ❖ Field Trips
Field trips are permitted with the following protocols:
 - Mask wearing at all times.
 - Social distancing
 - Personal water bottles only
- ❖ Campus Access – Parents & Visitors
NIS is a closed campus. All entrances are monitored and guarded. Visitors and parents will not be allowed to enter the main section of the school.

NIS COVID-19 Contingency Plan






❖ Action for Positive Cases & Symptoms

- A person with a confirmed positive diagnosis of COVID via either ATK or PCR must stay home for 7 days
- A person with symptoms is required to remain home for 24 hours after the following symptoms are clear.
 - A low-grade fever of 37.5 °C/99.50 °F
 - Breathing problems
 - Vomiting/Diarrhea
 - Severe sore throat
 - Running nose
 - Coughing
 - Extreme Fatigue
 - Loss of smell and taste

❖ ATK Testing Requirement

- Any person with symptoms will be required to report a negative ATK result prior to returning to school.
- In the event of more than 5 positive cases in one class, the whole class will be required to stay home for 3 days to monitor symptoms. During this time, the school will perform deep cleaning of the classrooms. After these 3 days, students are required to report negative ATK results prior to returning to school.
- Students are required to submit negative ATK test results after vacation periods (i.e. Summer Break, October Break, December Break, and Songkran Break) prior to returning to school.
